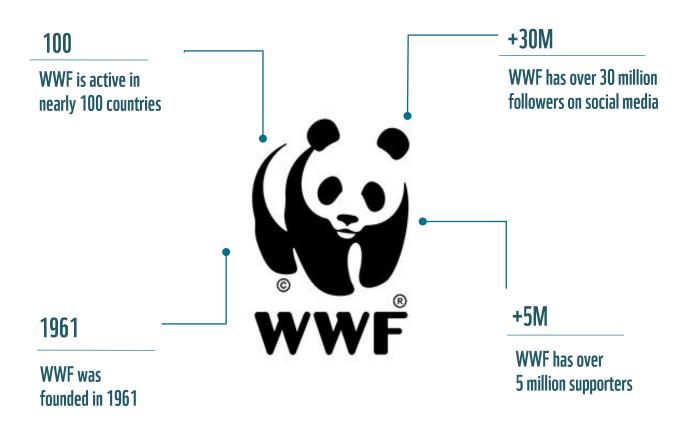


About WWF

This is why businesses have a crucial role to play in supporting conservation efforts and being part of the solution.

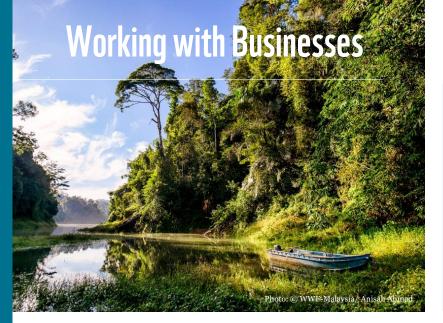
Changes in corporate practice are essential if there is to be real progress in tackling conservation challenges like climate change, clean energy solutions and ensuring the sustainable use of natural resources.
